Canby Barrel Race Club was formed in 1970. The purpose of the Canby Barrel Race Club is to provide a central meeting place to ride, help to promote the sport of Barrel Racing, and for all members to have a good time while enjoying the company of others who share the same interest, "BARREL RACING".

MEMBERSHIP:

- A. General membership shall be open to men, women, boys, and girls. We reserve the right to refuse or revoke membership.
- B. Junior – a Junior Member is 17 years of age or less as of January 1. Juniors and Pee Wee's shall not be eligible for office, except Junior Director. Minors shall be under the supervision of parents or an adult who is responsible at all times.
- C. Meetings shall be the Third Tuesday of each month, **unless prior approval by the board to move the date.**
- D. CBRC membership year **will run June 1st - May 31st.**
- E. Elections will be held at the last meeting of the season, prior to the annual banquet. The new officers will be announced at the annual banquet.
- E. New officers will take over responsibilities beginning June 1.

MEMBERSHIP DUES:

- A. Individual annual renewal fee is \$80.00 (includes \$10.00 annual membership renewal and \$10.00 per month ride fee).
- B. Family annual renewal is \$120.00 (includes \$15.00 annual family membership renewal and \$15.00 per month ride fee).
- C. NEW Individual members will pay a one time initiation fee of \$95.00 (includes \$25.00 new membership fee and \$10.00 per month ride fee).
- D. NEW Family memberships will pay a one time fee of \$130.00 (includes \$25.00 new family membership fee and \$15.00 per month ride fee).
- E. NEW Non-Rider membership fee is \$20.00 per year. Renewal fee for Non-Rider is \$10.00 per year.
- F. "RIDE ONLY" MEMBERSHIP: Single renewal \$140, Family Renewal \$180. New single membership \$155, New family membership \$190
 - 1. Family Members are defined as (Spouse or Significant Other and Minor Relatives under 18 years of age as of January 1) to receive family rates.
 - 2. If renewal fee is not paid by December's Jackpot then they will have to RE-JOIN as a new member by paying the appropriate fees.
 - 3. Membership dues must be paid in full to receive membership privileges, including voting, riding and points. Membership year runs **June 1st to May 31st**. Your points will not count until AFTER your club membership has been paid in full.
 - 4. Ride Only members do not have voting privileges and are not eligible for club awards. They are not required to work at jackpots.

CLUB AWARDS – ELIGIBILITY AND POINT SYSTEM:

- A. All members must work **5** of the **8** Jackpots during the winter series to receive year-end club **and worker-bee awards**(Pee Wee's exempt). Members **MUST** sign the Worker-bee checklist at the race or at the meeting directly following the race in order for their work to count for year end awards.
- B. All members must ride **5** of the **8** winter Jackpots (**October - April**) to receive year-end club awards. Pee Wee members must ride in **5** of **7** winter jackpots (**October - April**) to receive year-end awards.
- C. If a member cannot attend, they must find someone to work their spot or they will not be eligible for club year-end awards. Any exceptions must be approved by the board.
- D. Each renewing member must attend **5** general meetings out of the **10** scheduled meetings, starting in **July** to be eligible for club awards. New members joining after start of series must attend a minimum of 4 meetings to qualify for year-end awards. Members must sign the attendance sheet at EVERY meeting they attend in order for it to be counter for year end awards. **Juniors are exempt from meeting requirements, however parents are encourage to attend and vote on behalf of their child/children. Pee Wee's are exempt and have no voting privileges.**
- E. The criteria stated in A, B, C and D must be met by the last Jackpot of the season and the **April** meeting. The year end banquet does not count as a club meeting.
- F. Any bad checks received by a club member must be reconciled before any points or awards are given and members will be on a cash only basis until the check has been reconciled, including any outstanding fees. If a

second offense occurs, member is on a cash only basis for the remainder of the year. **A third offense will place them on a cash only basis for life.** No awards will be received by a member who has not met the above criteria by the end of March.

- G. POINTS:** Points will be earned by the highest placing club members in each division/per each race, Horse and Rider combination. There will be NO points given if a barrel is knocked over. Points will be awarded as follows: 1st = 16 pts, 2nd = 13 pts, 3rd = 10 pts, 4th = 7 pts, 5th = 4 pts, 6th = 1 pts.
- H. Club awards** will be given to a minimum of 10 Places in Open. Youth and Senior awards will be figured at 50% of qualified riders with a maximum of 10 places. All Pee Wee's will receive awards. The points earned at each race will be totaled per Horse and Rider combination, for total points earned in each Class.
- I. Year-end points** for Club Members will be tallied at the FINAL JACKPOT. All ties will be decided by a flip of a coin or a run off. All contestants must agree to a **run off**. If they do not agree to a **run off a flip of a coin** will decide the winner.
- J. There shall be an awards banquet** at the conclusion of the season. Awards earned through out the year will be presented at this time.
- K. Special Awards** shall be: Most Improved Horse, Most Improved Rider, Service and Sportsmanship. In case of ties for Special Awards, the Club will buy another award.

OFFICERS: The officers shall consist of a President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer. Officers cannot hold office for more than two consecutive years.

PRESIDENT: Shall conduct all meetings and see that rules and by-laws of the club are enforced. Voting procedures shall follow Robert's Rules of Order. The President may be co-signer with the Vice-President, Secretary or Treasurer on all checks.

VICE-PRESIDENT: In absence of President, shall have powers to perform duties of the President. He/She shall be responsible for all equipment.

SECRETARY: Shall keep minutes and report at all meetings. He/She shall handle all correspondence (i.e. thank yous, meeting notices, etc.). He/She shall be custodian of all documents and records. This person is in charge of "New Member Packets" and will give them to all 1st year members.

TREASURER: Shall collect all money due the club, disperse moneys to cover approved club expenses, and furnish treasurer's report at each meeting. The Treasurer may be co-signer with the President, Vice-President or Secretary on all checks.

COMMITTEES: Committees shall consist of Public Relations/Points, Jackpot Committee and Awards Chairpersons.

WEBSITE TECH: Is in charge updating our website with the most current information including, but not limited to; results, points, standings, meeting dates, club attendance, etc.

SPONSORSHIP COMMITTEE: In charge of coordinating club sponsors and working with the awards committee.

PUBLIC RELATIONS: Is in charge of keeping all newspaper and magazine articles current, shall be the "good-will" ambassador at all club functions, and shall keep the scrap book up to date. They will be in charge of updating the Competitor News and making a list of members who do not currently received the Comp News from another association.

POINTS: He/She shall keep track of all Jackpot and Club points. Points will be posted at each Jackpot. He/She will email updated points to the Website Tech to be put on our CBRC website after each race.

AWARDS: Responsible for securing awards for Series Awards, Sudden-Death Awards, Club Year-End Awards, and the Special Awards.

WEDNESDAY NIGHT RIDE: Members only can come and ride. The schedule shall be left to the decision of the club members. Arena must be cleared and all vehicles must be off the fairground premises by 10:00 PM. Barrels to be set up at 6:30 PM. **Arena time is 6:30 to 9:30**

JACKPOT: See separate rule's sheet.

OFFICER AND COMMITTEE RECOGNITION: Awards to outgoing officers and committee persons may be given if funds allow.

GENERAL RULES:

- A.** There will be an Agenda of items on the monthly meeting notice.
- B.** There must be 30% of active members present, including 2 officers, at a meeting in order for a vote to take place.
- C.** Officer votes will be used when a decision needs to be made before the next meeting. Total of 4 officers and one committee chairperson. These must be as follows: (1) President, (2) Vice-President, (3) Secretary, (4) Treasurer and (5) Points. Back up if needed are (1) Awards.
- D.** Meeting notices are **emailed** out as a reminder to club members of the date, time, location and topics to be discussed **a minimum of 7 days in advance by Secretary**
- E.** All participate at your own risk.
- F.** Conduct: The conduct shall be sportsman-like. If there is any dissatisfaction, it is to be brought up in front of the membership.
- G.** CBRC **officers** shall make the final decision regarding any and all disputes.
- H.** Any member in good standing can receive one free race entry for every saddle sponsor they bring to the club. They can receive their 1 free run after the saddle sponsorship has been paid in full.

JACKPOT RULES

2009 / 2010

JACKPOTS: To be held October **10th**, November **14th**, December **5th**, January **2nd**, February **6th**, & March **6th**. Except in case of make ups due to unforeseen circumstances. Make-up races will be scheduled at the earliest date available. **April 3th will be our last race of the season, but it is not included in the series.**

BRN4D RULES APPLY WHERE APPLICABLE

ENTRIES FOR RACES IN OCTOBER, NOVEMBER, DECEMBER, JANUARY, FEBRUARY, & APRIL:

- ENTRIES CLOSE AT 10:00 AM FOR THE OPEN DRAW.
 - Late OPEN entries will be taken from 10:00 am to 10:30 am.
 - Late entries for youth, senior, & novice will be taken until the **start of each class**.
 - Late entries will run at the bottom of the draw.
 - ALL ENTRIES TAKEN AFTER 10:00 AM WILL BE CHARGED A \$10 LATE FEE PER HORSE.
1. Time Only's: 8:30 – 10:00am Standard time only's – one time through the pattern. A fine of **\$10.00** for using excessive training. **NO WALKING.**
 2. Open arena: 10:00 am – 10:30am
 3. Arena Closed: 10:30 am – 11:00 am for Arena drag & setup.
 4. Race time: 11:00 am
 5. An arena fee of \$7.00 per HORSE, per Jackpot will be assessed at the time of entry. Current CBRC Members, Pee Wee's and Time Only Entries are exempt from the \$7.00 arena charge.
 6. The draw will determine what order horses are run, even if rider is entering more than one horse. Horses ridden out of order will receive a no time. For a contestant running more than one horse, every effort will be made to ensure that there will be a minimum of 10 horses ran in between if numbers and draw allows.
 7. Race will be run in the following order:
 1. Pee Wee
 2. Open 4D Entry fee: 45.00 Added Money: \$500.00
 3. Junior 4D Entry fee: 20.00 none
 4. Senior 4D Entry fee: 25.00 none
 5. \$500 Novice 4D Entry fee: 25.00 none
 6. Futurity & Derby Entry fee: 20.00 none
 8. **MARCH RACE:** Is a double header & year end awards.
 - 1) Time only's 8:00 am to 9:00 am
 - 2) Open Arena 9:00 am to 9:30 am
 - 3) Arena Closed 9:30am to 10:am am for Arena drag & setup.
 - 4) Race time: 10:00am
 - 5) All other race guidelines apply

HOW ENTRIES WILL WORK:

- OPEN Entries close at 9AM to be in the draw for BOTH AM & PM races.
- Open AM Race Late entries - will be taken from 9am to 9:30am
- Open PM Race Late entries - will be taken until the end of ALL AM classes
- Late entries for Youth, Senior, & Novice will be taken until the START of each class & added to the end of there class.
- Late entries will run at the bottom of the draw.
- ALL ENTRIES TAKEN AFTER 9:00 AM WILL BE CHARGED A \$10 LATE FEE PER HORSE.

N.S.F. CHECKS: If a contestant has a N.S.F. check, he/she may not enter any CBRC Jackpots until he/she has made that check good.

- ♦ 1st Offense – Pay all fees incurred (\$25.00 N.S.F. fee).
- ♦ 2nd Offense – Pay all fees incurred (\$25.00 N.S.F. fee) and will be placed on a cash-only basis for the rest of the season.
- ♦ 3rd Offense - **Pay all fees incurred. Cash only for life.**
- ♦ Lost Checks – The contestant will be responsible for all stop payment fees, with moneys being deducted from replacement check.

AGE CLASSIFICATIONS: Are determined as stated below, and maintained throughout the season.

- ♦ Pee Wee Class: 10 and under as of the **first pee wee competition of the season**, and have not competed in any other class.
- ♦ Junior 4D: **17** and under as of **first youth competition of season**.
- ♦ Senior 4D: 45 and over as of **first senior competition**.

\$500 NOVICE: Horse or rider must have \$500.00 or less at time of entry. **Entrant must state the lifetime earnings at the time of entry.** Will be run as a 4D class. No time for being off course or down barrels. The penalties for wrongfully entering the \$500 Novice class will be as follows:

1. Forfeiture of entry fee and any money won for said Jackpot.
2. A \$15.00 assessed wrong entry fee charge.
3. Failure to pay fees and fines would result in being blacklisted until all obligations are met.

COURSE: Pattern shall be set using CBRC's course marker (rope). **In case of a double header,** AM Jackpot to start with white rope measured from 3rd barrel (to rail), PM Jackpot using pink rope measured from 3rd barrel (to rail). 1st and 2nd barrels are 18 feet from the wall, timers set at 35 feet from 1st and 2nd barrels. No exceptions will be made unless the ground is deemed unsafe, with Jackpot Committee/Board approval.

MISCELLANEOUS RULES:

1. No abusive treatment of animals will be accepted by CBRC.
2. We will honor all Associations' Blacklists.
3. We reserve the right to refuse entry to anyone.
4. Any rider with unattended children, whose safety is in question, will be given one warning by the CBRC Club. If a second offense occurs, the CBRC will forfeit the Rider's points for that day, and the rider will be eliminated from that day's races.
5. All participate at your own risk.
6. Heeled boots for riding are required.
7. If a rider does not show up after the 3rd call, they will lose their run with no refund given out.
8. CBRC officials shall make the final decision regarding any and all disputes.

CBRC NOMINATED SERIES AWARD RULES

MUST COMPETE IN 5 OF 7 RACES FOR AWARDS

NOMINATION FOR SERIES AWARDS:

- A. PEE WEE:** Nomination fee of \$10.00.
- B. OPEN 4D:** Nomination fee of \$35.00 (Horse/Rider Combination).
- C. JUNIOR 4D:** Nomination fee of \$35.00 (Horse/Rider Combination).
- D. SENIOR 4D:** Nomination fee of \$35.00 (Horse/Rider Combination).
- E. \$500 NOVICE: NO SERIES AWARDS.**
- F.** Nominations excepted in October, November or Prior to the start of the December Jackpot.
- G. ONLY THOSE POINTS EARNED AFTER NOMINATION WILL COUNT TOWARDS YEAR-END AWARDS.** Last chance to nominate is before the race in December. If a person nominates at the December race, they must compete in all of the remaining Jackpots to be eligible for awards **(DEC THRU MARCH)**
- H. JUNIORS AND SENIORS:**
IF YOU WANT TO NOMINATE TO BOTH YOUR AGE LIMITED CLASS AND THE OPEN 4D, YOU WILL HAVE TO PAY **TWO** NOMINATION FEES AND ENTER EACH DIVISION FOR POINTS TO COUNT. POINTS WILL BE KEPT IN THEIR RESPECTIVE CLASS

OPEN 4D AWARDS:

- A.** Series awards will be given to 10 Places for the total combined points earned in the Open 4D class.
- B.** Nominated Horse/Rider combination must enter and compete in 5 of the 7 Open 4D Jackpots to be eligible for awards.
- C. POINTS:** Points will be awarded in **EACH** 4D division as follows:
1st = 16 pts, 2nd = 13 pts, 3rd = 10 pts, 4th = 7 pts, 5th = 4 pts, 6th = 1 pts.
Points will be awarded by refiguring the race using only nominated horse/rider combination. For Example: The fastest nominated horse/rider combination in the class will be the winner of the 1D, receiving 16 points. The rest of the race will be figured accordingly off of this riders fast time.
- D.** At Year-End the points earned in any division of the respective classes will be combined, per Horse/Rider combination, for total points earned.
Example:
Jane Doe @ 48pts, (High-Point) – (2D earned 20pts, 3D earned 13pts and 4D earned 15pts).
Joe Smith @ 44pts, (Reserve High-Point) – (1D earned 14pts, 2D earned 20pts and 3D earned 10pts).
Jan Brown @ 42pts, (Runner-up) – (3D earned 20pts and 2D earned 22pts).
- E.** No time for knocked over barrels or off course.
- F.** No points earned for knocked over barrels or off course.
- G.** Heeled riding boots required.

PEE WEE AWARDS:

- A. Series awards will be given to all nominated and qualified Pee Wee's.
- B. **Pee Wee Division – 10 and under as of 1st Pee Wee Race of our series.**
- C. Pee Wee's must ride alone to be eligible for the awards (may be lead by a person on foot. Not ponied).
- D. Pee Wee's must enter and compete in 4 of the 6 Jackpots to be eligible for awards.
- E. POINTS: Points will be awarded as follows:
1st = 16 pts, 2nd = 13 pts, 3rd = 10 pts, 4th = 7 pts, 5th = 4 pts, 6th = 1 pts
- F. At Year-End the points earned will be combined, per Pee Wee nominee, for total points earned (see example under Open - item D)
- G. Pee Wee's that knock over barrels will place according to their time **BEHIND** Pee Wee's that are penalty free. 5 second penalty for each knocked over barrel.
- H. No points will be earned if a Pee Wee goes off course.
- I. If child has moved out of the Pee Wee class to the Junior 4D, their points will not follow them. If a pee wee moves into the Junior Class they can not go back to the pee wee class for the remaining part of the series. The pee wee can still receive their pee wee year end award if they have qualified for it.
- J. **Pee Wee's: No cross entry with Junior 4D.**
- K. Healed riding boots required.

JUNIOR 4D AWARDS:

- A. Series awards will be given to 4 Places for the total combined points earned in the Junior 4D class.
- B. Nominated Horse/Rider combination must enter and compete in 5 of the 7 Junior 4D Jackpots to be eligible for awards.
- C. POINTS: Points will be awarded in **EACH** 4D division as follows:
1st = 16 pts, 2nd = 13 pts, 3rd = 10 pts, 4th = 7 pts, 5th = 4 pts, 6th = 1 pts.
Points will be awarded by refiguring the race using only nominated horse/rider combination. For Example: The fastest nominated horse/rider combination in the class will be the winner of the 1D, receiving 16 points. The rest of the race will be figured accordingly off of this riders fast time.
- D. At Year-End the points earned in any division of the respective classes will be combined, per Horse/Rider combination, for total points earned.
Example:
Jane Doe @ 48pts, (High-Point) – (2D earned 20pts, 3D earned 13pts and 4D earned 15pts).
Joe Smith @ 44pts, (Reserve High-Point) – (1D earned 14pts, 2D earned 20pts and 3D earned 10pts).
Jan Brown @ 42pts, (Runner-up) – (3D earned 20pts and 2D earned 22pts).
- E. No time for knocked over barrels or off course.
- F. No points earned for knocked over barrels or off course.
- G. **Junior's: No cross entry with Pee Wee class.**
- H. 2 for 1 option is available between the Open 4D and the Junior 4D races. Junior's may opt to carry their time from the Open 4D. They must designate at the time of entry that this is what they are going to do. Any penalty will be carried forward to the Junior class.
- I. **Junior 4D – 17 and under as of first youth competition of series.**
- J. Once a child enters the JUNIOR 4D, they may not go back and enter the PEE WEE class for the rest of the Winter Series.
- K. Healed riding boots required.

SENIOR 4D AWARDS:

- A. Series awards will be given to 4 Places for the total combined points earned in the Senior 4D class.
- B. Nominated Horse/Rider combination must enter and compete in 5 of the 7 Senior 4D Jackpots to be eligible for awards.
- C. POINTS: Points will be awarded in **EACH** 4D division as follows:
1st = 16 pts, 2nd = 13 pts, 3rd = 10 pts, 4th = 7 pts, 5th = 4 pts, 6th = 1 pts
Points will be awarded by refiguring the race using only nominated horse/rider combination. For Example: The fastest nominated horse/rider combination in the class will be the winner of the 1D, receiving 16 points. The rest of the race will be figured accordingly off of this riders fast time.
- D. At Year-End the points earned in any division of the respective classes will be combined, per Horse/Rider combination, for total points earned.
Example:
Jane Doe @ 48pts, (High-Point) – (2D earned 20pts, 3D earned 13pts and 4D earned 15pts).
Joe Smith @ 44pts, (Reserve High-Point) – (1D earned 14pts, 2D earned 20pts and 3D earned 10pts).
Jan Brown @ 42pts, (Runner-up) – (3D earned 20pts and 2D earned 22pts).
- E. No time for knocked over barrels or off course.
- F. No points earned for knocked over barrels or off course.
- G. 2 for 1 option is available between the Open 4D and the Senior 4D races. Senior's may opt to carry their time from the Open 4D. They must designate at the time of entry that this is what they are going to do. Any penalty will be carried forward to the Senior class.
- H. **Senior 4D – 45 and over as of first Senior competition of series.**
- I. Healed boots for riding required.

8. **MISCELLANIOUS RULES:**

- A. Points will be awarded as earned.
- B. In 4D classes, no time will be given if penalties are incurred.
- C. To receive your award you must be present or have a representative to receive your award for you. Failure to do so will result in forfeiture of the award and will be given to the next highest point earner.
- D. All ties will be decided by a **flip of a coin or a run off. All contestants must agree to a run off. If they do not agree to a run off a flip of a coin will decide the winner.** If one of the contestants involved in the tie is not present, they forfeit to the contestant that is present.
- E. CBRC officials shall make the final decision regarding any and all disputes.
- F. Western boots required.

CBRC SUDDEN DEATH RULES

1. **FORMAT FOR SUDDEN DEATH RACE:**

All nominated horse/rider combinations will be tracked by time for the day. Their times from race one and two will be added together to determine the fastest aggregate time.

ELIGIBILITY AND RULES:

- A. Horse/Rider combination must have **NOMINATED** to the Open 4D, Youth or Senior class and paid a \$30.00 Nomination fee to that class.
- B. Nominated Horse/Rider combination must have competed in 5 of 7 races in the class that they have nominated to.
- C. Down barrel will take you out of the average.
- D. All **QUALIFIED** nominated Horse/Rider combinations are eligible for Sudden Death
- E. All ties for Sudden Death will be decided **by a flip of a coin or a run off. All contestants must agree to a run off. If they do not agree to a run off a flip of a coin will decide the winner.** If one of the contestants involved in the tie is not present, they forfeit to the contestant that is present.
- F. Sudden Death and year awards are figured separately, you will earn points on this day that will count towards year end high point awards.
- G. Pee Wee's and \$500 Novice classes do not have Sudden Death finals.
- H. CBRC officials shall make the final decision regarding any and all disputes.
